Nominations for all the above mentioned Offices and Management positions are invited from Members, all of whom must be in current membership of the Branch, or duly appointed by the Management Committee.

Nominations must be submitted on the Official Nomination form attached to this notice and bear the Signatures of the Nominee, Proposer, and Seconder. Electronic signatures are valid and may be validated.

Nominees may submit a 150 word profile of themselves to be included with ballot papers in the event of an election having to be undertaken.

Voting where required shall take place at the AGM in accordance with clause 6.3 of the Branch Constitution which states:

"Any resolution put to the vote of a general meeting of the Branch shall be decided upon a show of hands based on the 'one Member, one Vote' principle adopted at the 2015 AGM. Therefore, any member present in person shall have one vote only irrespective of the number of offices any member may hold. In the event of an equality of votes upon any resolution, the Chair of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote."

An individual attending the AGM either face to face or virtually as the nominated representative of a Member eligible to vote must, prior to the commencement of the AGM, provide written confirmation of such nomination to the Chair of the meeting (as permitted under clause 12.1 of the Articles of RLSS UK).

If written confirmation is not presented and is not signed by an eligible Member then the returning officer will decide if the authorisation form is accepted or not. If two or more individuals submit authorisation forms for the same Member, no vote will be recorded on behalf of that Member.

The Annual Report and other relevant documents for the Branch AGM will be issued only to Members of the Branch Management Committee, all Past Presidents, Local Managers of the Branch and Affiliated Member Groups.

However, any member of the Branch wishing to receive these papers other than those already mentioned may receive them provided they request a copy from the undersigned, no later than 15th March 2021.

All such requests should be accompanied with a Stamped Self-addressed Envelope **35cm by 25 cm** (A4 document) in size stamped to the value of £1.83.

When we celebrated the New Year at the beginning of 2020 waving goodbye to a wonderful 2019, life was normal as we knew it.

KENT BRANCH was preparing and looking forward to its 60th Anniversary Celebration events!

And Then...

COVID19 hit us and the 23rd March 2020 became a day we will never forget... the UK government introduced a full Lockdown and all of a sudden our life styles changed.

We had to cancel the Kent Branch AGM on the 28th March 2020. However, during the Lockdown the Society and the Kent Branch management team have carried on their work within obvious constraints, Kent had sent out two Branch newsletters via HO during this difficult period and presented a Kent Branch open meeting on 21st November 2020 to stay in touch with our Kent members and update them on with events and activities around the county. During the open meeting, our Kent Branch President Andy Griggs remotely presented awards to the recipients of the RLSS Kent Branch 2019 Honours followed by the RLSS National Honour recipients.

In September 2020, RLSS UK's President, Mark Smith and CEO Robert Gofton launched the RLSS UK's Strategic Framework 2020-2025 by hosting a webinar. Our new strapline 'Enjoy Water SAFELY' has replaced 'The Drowning Prevention Charity' and whilst the society will strive towards a nation without drowning, this change signifies a shift in focus towards a wider remit to help everyone enjoy water safely.

I am seeing from the online official and unofficial meetings I have been involved with during 2020 and early 2021, a wider aspect of the Branch's members are showing interest in becoming more involved with the Branch to meet the Society's aims and goals.

I have seen clubs sharing information regarding their club activities and the benefit of Zoom / Microsoft teams/Skype and many other platforms to have discussions with fellow lifesavers. We look forward to the first ever virtual online RLSS Kent Branch AGM on 27th March 2021.

Hopefully, with the vaccine roll out during 2021 and a better understanding of this awful global virus, doors will start to open for us, as we are usually a highly active Branch of the Society and enable us to go out and deliver the new message. Maybe, we can get back to a lifestyle that is more familiar to us.

TREASURER'S REPORT

When I drafted the 2019 report none of us had any idea of the impact that the then recent reports of a virus spreading would have on the world. The decision by RLSS UK to suspend for 2020 the requirement for Branches to hold AGMs in 2020 meant that the 2019 accounts were received by but not formally published in the Branch. They were though consolidated in the 2019 Society Annual Accounts, approved by the Auditors and noted at the 2020 RLSS UK AGM in October 2020.

The 2020 accounts will go to the Society's Auditors during Q2 2021 and will be presented to the national AGM later in the year within the consolidated accounts of RLSS UK. All RLSS UK members will receive due notice of this and will be able to receive the national accounts at that time.

Below you will see the Branch financial reports for each of 2019 and 2020.

Year ended 31st December 2019 – (statement as prepared for the 2020 AGM)

The Kent Branch continues be one of the 3 highest income generation Branches of RLSS UK producing income of nearly £17000 and the Officers of the Branch recognised the efforts of all members and clubs in promoting the work of the Society within the county.

I reported for 2018 that after 4 years of seeing an increase in reserves your Management Committee made a conscious decision to increase expenditure in 2018 on Branch activities and on the promotion of the Society drowning prevention campaigns resulting in an overall deficit for 2018 of approximately £1500 with reserves falling to just over £28000. I also indicated that we would maintain a similar level of expenditure in 2019.

The membership income figure for 2019 is less than that for 2018 due to a variation in how the income received in 2018 was recorded. The rolling 12 month membership data does not show a reduction in the number of members within Kent. Excluding organisations registered as ATCs, as of 28th February 2020 Kent Branch had 16 active Clubs and 332 current members of RLSS UK.

The Profit and Loss Account and Balance Sheet for the Branch have been received from HQ and show the 2019 provisional outturn as at 28th February 2020. The national accounts go to the Society's Auditors during Q2 and will be presented to the national AGM later in the year within the consolidated accounts of RLSS UK. All RLSS UK members will receive due notice of this and will be able to receive the national accounts at that time.

The welcome increase in income has coincided with an unexpected reduction in actual direct expenditure due to the annual National Conference in 2019 being cancelled and a reduction in competition related expenditure. This has generated an operating profit of £900. This, alongside a increase in donations associated with our Community Outreach activities sees our reserves returning to just over £30K.

One note of caution thought is that due to a change from 1st Jan 2020, the value of the proportions of the proportions being received by Branches is to be reduced slightly, resulting in a fall in expected income.

Thank you to all members who continue to support the work of the Branch and particular thanks go to Stephen Goldsmith who over the past few years has done a sterling job as our Awards and Sales Officer.

I hope we have an equally enjoyable and successful year in 2020.

Year ended 31st December 2020

It will come as no surprise to learn that activity within the Branch (and therefore income) fell off the cliff edge in March 2020. However, clubs and our Community Outreach Team had been active to that point and some activity returned later in Q3 and in Q4. This meant that direct income was reduced to just over £7000 for the year with a similar level of related expenditure.

Overall the Branch Accumulated Total Funds fell slightly from £30,387 to £30,149 as a consequence of expenditure in Q1 from our designated SABL funds that we were unable to fully replace with donations due to the cessation of courses from March 2020.

The overall financial picture for the Branch though is that we remain financially viable, having build up sufficient reserves in recent years to sustain us through to 2022 by which time we may hope that lifesaving activity within the Branch has been able to return to something approaching previous levels.

My thanks go to all members, volunteers and supporters that continue to support the Branch and in particular to the SABL Team whose outstanding efforts results in the receipt of many donations to the Branch each year and also to Stephen Goldsmith who continues to do sterling job as our Awards and Sales Officer.

BRANCH SAFEGUARDING OFFICER'S REPORT 2019

This is my first report since taking over the position in the summer of 2019 from Debbie Hunt – a very hard act to follow.

As promised by Debbie, the Branch held a very well attended Safeguarding course at Small Talks in October 2019. Whilst it is essential Club Welfare and Branch Welfare Officers attend an RLSS Safeguarding course, any Kent Branch members who would like to participate in this training are welcome. Please contact me if you would like to attend an RLSS Safeguarding course. Checking DBS paperwork and evidence has kept me quite busy and I would urge members to register for the Update Service as this negates the need to continually renew by paper, the process is simple and free for volunteers (www.gov.uk/dbs-update service). Following registration you will only be asked to apply for a new DBS Certificate if the DBS Update Service indicates there are changes to your status. I would also like to remind everyone that DBS checks are required for all those undertaking a role who are 16 years and over.

It is hoped the new Tahdah system will eventually allow Clubs Welfare officers to keep an eye on the expiry of DBS certificates. HO will still require a copy of DBS certificates, but these can be uploaded or emailed to RLSSTahdah for direct approval.

Thankfully incidents reported to me have been minimal but if there are any issues you wish to discuss, please contact me asap.

BRANCH SAFEGUARDING OFFICER'S REPORT 2020

Sadly, due to the coronavirus pandemic, apart from running two Safeguarding courses in January and February 2020 and assisting clubs with completion of DBS applications, the past year has been very quiet and there really is not much for me to tell you, although one piece of good news is that an online refresher course is now available for those who need to revalidate their RLSS UK Safeguarding qualification. The RLSS UK Safeguarding qualification is valid for two years and HO should contact you when your renewal is due.

Hopefully in the coming months we will be able to come out of "hibernation" and look forward to resuming to our lifesaving activities, even if some restrictions are still in place for a while. Looking forward to meeting up with everyone later this year.

These range from: Training all ages, in lifesaving and personnel survival techniques, to allow individuals to progress through RLSS UK award suites.

In the competition field, clubs in Kent are very active and hold their own, which reflects in the results gained at Regional and National championships.

RLSS UK objectives are delivered by the Branch as community awareness programmes and they encourage clubs to engage.

Various clubs within Kent also provide awareness in the form of outreach work, such as bag packing days. Local events such as festivals and carnivals. Talks and demonstrations such as the Save a Baby programme.

Outside the club world, organisations are continually providing vocational RLSS UK lifeguard training courses for those who are seeking employment in the swimming pool/beach environments. The RNLI provide a beach lifeguard service for fifteen of Kent beaches and are now actively engaged with RLSS clubs.

So, what's in store for next year? Continue spreading the message and to extend and engage a larger audience. No big leaps though! However, through planning, identifying and implementing strategies the impact can strengthen clubs. One initiative being considered is a festival of lifesaving which would capture the elements mentioned above which in turn will raise awareness, further engagement and create and establish partnerships.

I thought that this report wouldn't take long to summarise as the activities in 2020 were brought to an abrupt end, however when I looked back and allowed myself to remember it seems that 2020 was about to be an amazing year, and what we did do was great.

January had only just started when Andy and I ran a SABL for SURESTART on the 6^{th of} January followed by an SACL at the Cyclopark on the 16th with Bridget.

February started quietly on the 3rd with Andy and I running a SABL for SURESTART, and February 13th Andy, Bridget and I ran a SABL workshop at Cyclopark. 2nd March was a SURESTART and Andy, Bridget and I ran a SACL on the 12th.

One Thursday evening in January, I was answering messages I had received on Facebook, and booking people onto the most suitable workshop, when a message popped up on my screen asking if there was a workshop for young people as his daughter would like to come along. I jumped at the opportunity, checked the room availability, and got back to the dad and said if there was enough interest, I would run a workshop dedicated to over eight-year-olds, providing they bring a responsible adult. I published the course on Facebook on Friday lunchtime and by ten past ten Saturday morning I had to close the booking and start a waiting list.

One of the responses to this workshop was a teacher, asking if I would run something for her year group, their project for the term was 'health'. Response was made with suggested lesson plans, and Andy agreed to join me. Just as plans were made lockdown began.

If this was three months the rest of the year, well who knows. I certainly have some clinics and school children to meet when the time comes.

Andrew Fooks/Andrew Griggs – Heartstart

Working closely with Cyclopark, Gravesend, Gravesham Lifesaving Club have provided the outreach courses throughout the year for clubs, and Park Run Marshalls.

Gravesham started a PAD campaign in 2019 to fund, or help fund public donations, to provide an AED 24/7 for the local community as a result of this the first one was installed at the Gravesend Boat Public House in March 2020. The Heartstart team train around 100-120 people per year and look to run open courses every 3 or 4 months.

"Im sorry, I just nodded off!"

Andy Fooks recalls a heart warming event...

A few months ago on a really great Heartstart course, I trained the daughter and granddaughter of a man I transported to Ashford having suffered a heart attack. I had to shock the gentleman three times outside the operating theatre whilst waiting for the consultant to arrive.

The funny thing was when coming round he said, "Im sorry, I just nodded off!" The connection between Andy and the two girls was discovered during the course.



RLSS UK Shop understand this may increase the need for manikin wipes and lung replacements.

IMPORTANT CPR MANIKIN HYGIENE ADVICE:

The majority of resuscitation manikins have features that help prevent the spread of infection (including respiratory infections such as COVID-19). Here are the options that can be used for manikin hygiene:

Alcohol Wipes

MUST be used on the manikin to sanitise the face between learners. An emphasis should be placed on scrubbing the mouth area of the manikin. The chest, nose and forehead of the manikin can be wiped too if the possibility of 'hand to hand' transmission is a concern.

Resusci Manikin Wipes – Pk 1200 (RLSS UK Shop Code 152401) £252.12 incl VAT Resusci Manikin Wipes – Pk 50 (RLSS UK Shop Code 152400) £13.56 incl VAT 70% Alcohol Antibacterial Manikin Wipes 150 – Single Tub £12.50 incl VAT

CPR Face Shields

For maximum protection we recommend to use wipes and issue each learner with a face shield.

Filter face shields are available on a roll for CPR training. They don't offer complete bio-protection, but they will give a high level of safety when combined with wipes and a manikin that has a one-way valve (see below).

An obvious advantage to a learner using a face shield in practise is that they are familiar with using one if they ever need to give CPR for real.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If a learner re-uses a facemask for repeated CPR practise, they should ensure that the face mask is placed on the manikin same way around each time (so they blow into the same side of the mask each time).

Replacement Airways

Little Anne manikins are designed with a one-way-valve in the part of the airway that sits behind the face mask. The valve redirects expired air from the manikin's lungs out of the back of the head. This prevents contamination in the lungs coming out of the mouth towards the learner.

Little Anne airways must be **replaced frequently** (at least every course) failure to do this could result in the one-way valve failing. If the valve isn't working properly you can spot this as it becomes impossible to fill the lungs (because air leaks out the back of the head).

Laerdal Baby Anne and Laerdal MiniAnne (inflatable) manikins

The MiniAnne and Baby Anne manikins **DO NOT have a one-way-valve** – so contamination could theoretically be passed from the lungs with shared use.

The lungs must therefore be swapped between every learner practise.

To do this each learner would be issued with their own baby manikin lung. A face shield could provide alternative or additional protection.

Replacement Faces for Baby Anne are available so that each learner can have their own manikin face. This will reduce the reliance on alcohol wipes alone.

The faces can be disinfected after each class and re-used.


