If there is sufficient interest, we may undertake for those members over 12 years, a Young Leaders Course. This gives members skills and knowledge to plan, deliver and lead a Rookie

Festival or another Lifesaving Event as well as covering the different pathways available within Lifesaving. Theory being delivered online and continued practically when back in the pools.

Similarly, if sufficient interest, a Community Instructor Course can be arranged. Kent has an award-winning Team, providing the Save a Life Series as part of our Outreach Programme. Primarily Save a Babies Life courses 'normally' run throughout Kent providing parents and parents-to-be lifesaving knowledge on how to deal with choking and undertake CPR if needed.
